<p>TUESDAY</p> <p>October 16 19:30 h</p>	<p>Movie : 500 Nations, Part 3</p> <p>500 Nations is a documentary film about the history of America – specifically concerning native Americans.</p> <p><i>Episode # 5: "Cauldron of war".</i> Iroquois Democracy and the American Revolution. Europe fights for control of American resources. Many indigenous nations side with the trade-oriented French rather than the land-claiming English in the fierce French and Indian War. When the defeated French withdraw from the Ohio Valley and leave their Indian allies vulnerable, a determined leader rises to prominence: Pontiac.</p> <p><i>Episode # 6: "Removal".</i> War and Exile in the East. Shawnee leader Tecumseh challenges the tide of history, sparking a return to traditional ways and seizing upon the war of 1812 as the means to restore Indian sovereignty. In 1830, the Indian Removal Act becomes law. Many tribes stoically accept its decree. Others resist. <p>TUESDAY</p> <p>October 30 19:15 h</p>	<p>Guided Tour Underground Air-Raid Shelter (Stuttgart-Feuerbach)</p> <p>In the 1920s, the German government recognized the danger of air-raids against cities and started (some years later) the construction of air-raid shelters. The lessons learned during the second world war were that the inhabitants needed better protection against air-raids. During the Cold War, the German government built around 68,000 air-raid shelters for the citizens of Stuttgart.</p> <p>The association Schutzbauten Stuttgart e.V. will introduce us to the history of the underground air-raid shelters in Stuttgart. We will visit one underground air-raid shelter in Stuttgart-Feuerbach. Meeting point will be at 19:15h at the U-Bahn-Station, Bahnhof Feuerbach. 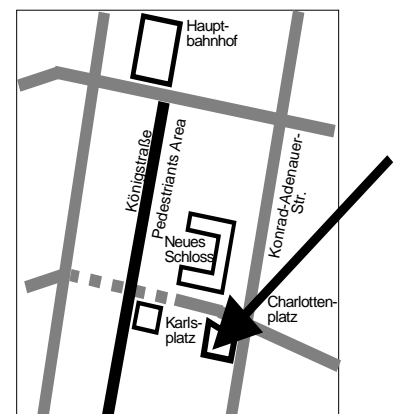
Tschengla (Austria) week-end ski trip – December 22/23 (week-end)
